# WASH Coalition Pilipinas



Started in 2004 through a partnership between the NGO Center for Water and Sanitation – ITN Foundation ([www.itnphil.org.ph](http://www.itnphil.org.ph)) and the Geneva-based professional association Water Supply and Sanitation Collaborative Council ([www.wsscc.org](http://www.wsscc.org)). It remains a loose coalition of organizations, LGUs, NGOs, communities and individuals working to achieve improved access to WASH for all. Coordinated by the PCWS-ITNF, the Coalition has local chapters in Bicol, Eastern Visayas, Davao and ARMM.

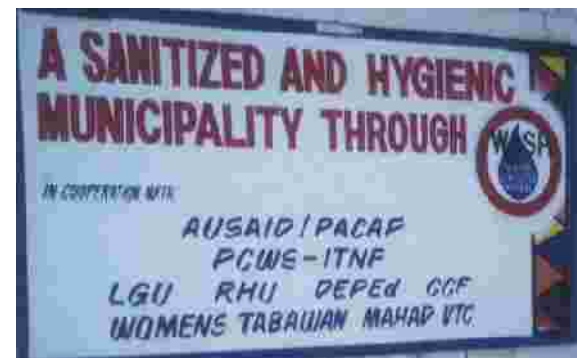

# Objective

To improve the water supply and sanitation situation in urban and rural poor communities through advocacy, awareness raising, multi-stakeholder partnerships, action research, introduction of low-cost water supply and sanitation technologies and capacity building for community managed WASH



# Structure of the WASH Coalition

Members decided during its 2008 strategic planning workshop that:

- The Coalition will remain a loose organization (not a legal entity) flexible enough to allow ease in implementing projects and achieving goals.
- The PCWS Executive Director is appointed National Coordinator .
- The National Coordinator is assisted by 4 small working groups on:
  1. Program Development and Resource Mobilization
  2. Advocacy and Networking
  3. Knowledge Management and Research
  4. Institutional Strengthening
- The PCWS serves as the WASH Coalition Secretariat.
- The formation of local chapters is encouraged, recognizing that the Philippines is an archipelago with diverse ethnic groups facing varied WASH situations and realities.
- The Coalition taps catalytic funding support from both WSSCC and PCWS.



# Activities of the WASH Coalition

- Advocacy for well maintained toilets and wash facilities in schools
- Information materials development for WASH advocacy & awareness raising
- WASH capacity building
- Research and knowledge management
- Networking and building partnerships
- Promoting environmental sanitation
- Introducing low-cost, culturally acceptable WASH technology options for schools, households and communities
- Working with the media
- Constructing water supply and sanitation facilities for communities and schools
- Establishing Coalition chapters in the provinces for a localized approach to building stronger partnerships for WASH



# Some Accomplishments

- Compilation and dissemination of Philippine laws and regulations on water and sanitation for IYS 2008
- Fund raising art exhibits for the implementation of water and sanitation projects in far flung communities
- WASH Radio Campaign 2009 with Silliman University
- Two members of the Coalition got elected to the WSSCC Steering Committee
- A Study on Personal and Home Hygiene in Flood Prone Communities in the Philippines was presented at the South Asia Hygiene Practitioners Workshop held in BRAC, Dhaka, Bangladesh in Feb. 2010; published at the websites of WSSCC, BRAC and IRC.

- Construction of over 300 low-cost water supply, sanitation and hygiene facilities for schools, mosques, communities and homes
- Production of various WASH information materials
